The Acropolis of Pergamum (Pergamon) is certainly dramatic, perched atop a high, steep-sided hill to the northeast of the modern city center. The great temples and dramatic theater are visible from anywhere in the city, as they were meant to be. The most prominent building here is the Traianeum, or Temple of Trajan, a huge marble temple that has been partially reconstructed from ruins found on the site Then it is off to Izmir for dinner and overnight

The grand port city of İzmir, Turkey's third-largest, is a proudly liberal, long-time centre of commerce that has emerged as a smart alternative base for travel in the west of the country. Formerly the famed Greek city of Smyrna, İzmir lives by its kordon (seafront) which, especially around leafy Alsancak, is as fetching and lively as any large seaside city in the world


