## **COURSE PLAN**

At the beginning of J-term, students will spend a number of hours together off-campus learning about the culture of Costa Rica and will then spend three weeks at a language institute in the town of Carrillos in Costa Rica. Small classes (4-5 students) meet from 8 - 12 M-F. Although the main academic focus will be Spanish language and culture, the classes will also explore the effects of globalization on Costa Rica through lectures at the institute and visits to sites including national parks. rainforests and businesses. The final grade is based on the grade at the institute, participation in activities and a final paper due upon return to Gustavus.
